



British/Commonwealth Canberras wear plenty of small stencil markings. This is an effective way to break up large smooth surfaces of the airframe and add another dimension to the miniature you are building. We present silkscreen printed set to cover this area (or alternatively - give you headache).



Wing stencils and lines are symmetrical. A-N lines come in two flavors: black (B) and yellow (Y). Use it according to your reference material. Several other decals also follow this pattern. For decals no 25, 26, 27 the G suffix stands for grey - an alternative for non-white aircraft.




Unfortunately we have not avoided some mistakes, so a few words of where we screw up and how you can easily fix it:

decal 19: both are identical, one of them should be mirrored. Easy to correct, by simply cutting the top bit of starboard piece and moving in towards the front.

decal 8: same as with no.19, but this time cut all three main sections of starboard piece apart and position it according to drawing.

Selecting "Actual Size" in Reader print option will result with true 1/144 scale drawings on A4 format.
