



Thunderjets arrived to France in December 1952 to replace D.H. Vampires. Airplanes were transferred from USAF reserves through Mutual Defence Assistance Program. First a Training Command is created at Reims to familiarize the pilots who were used to propeller driven airplanes with new propulsion. 46 F-84Es and over 300 F-84G equipped 1 ere Escadre de Chasse at Saint-Dizier, 3eme Escadre de Chasse at Reims, 4eme EC at Bremgarten/ /Luxeuil, 9eme EC at Metz and 11eme EC at Luxeuil F-84Gs.



French Thunderjets saw combat in October 1956 during Sues Crisis, when F-84Gs from 1ere EC provided support to Israeli forces during invasion at Sinai. Thunderjets operated from base at Lydda and performed ground-attack missions. As soon as in 1958 first Thunderjets began to be phased out from service, followed by disbanding of 1^{ere} and 9^{eme} EC. The airplanes were handed over to Greek and Turkish Air Forces. France last F-84 were disposed in 1966 – their place taken over by Mirages III...





This is one of aircrafts that performed in 1953 as a part of aerobatic team later known as "Patrouille de France".

It is perfect example of how little change the French made to original markings of USAF F-84s. Yes, the buzz number is gone replaced by French EC code and there are regular roundels. But the wing stars'n'bars are only partially covered by black bands and red hi-viz patches clearly keep the US insignia safely outlined. The tail serial number is retained and supplemented by french fin flash.

With limited space on decal sheet we chose to include more various markings rather than duplicate parts of insignia that are already supplied with Miniwing kit.

F-84s were the first jet airplanes to form aerobatic team "Patrouille de France" and the first to actually perform under this name. Commandant Pierre Delachena, pilot of the 3eme EC stationed at Reims-Champagne witnessed the display of USAF Skyblazers aerobatic team during their visit in France in 1952. This must have made significant impression upon Delachena and drove him to assign four F-84Gs to-then-unnamed team. Practice ensued, and soon French Thunderjets began touring around aerial meets.

Some F-84Gs performing in the team received red hi-viz markings, not all of them though.

In May 1953 the appropriate name adjoined. It was during the international aerial meeting on the field of Maison-Blanche in Constantine, Algeria. The journalist and show commentator Jacques Nætinger carried away by performance of four straight wing Republic jet fighters declared them "Patrouille de France". It hooked. Air Force general staff subsequently accepted it officially in September 1953.
